OUR WORDS

Greetings All!

Highlands War 18 was completed just one week ago.

All of Our war staff did an exemplary job! Thanks to all!

Just days before War, a great many people were hard at work organizing all the things that are required of a war, and even more folks helped setup and breakdown our war. This year was been particularly difficult due to site changes that were completed by Mormon Lake Lodge just a few days before Highlands took place. Lord Oso Bloodaxe did a fantastic job assigning land for all infrastructure tents and campers on setup day. The roads were a bit of a challenge to deal with, but the newly-installed motocross track presented some real reductions in available camping land.

This year we had a group of professional equestrians who demonstrated a variety of horse-mounted skills. Mounted archery is a growing sport among SCA equestrians – but it is also a great spectator sport. Her Majesties Equestrian Championship also happened at Highlands and was a real treat to watch. Rental horses are always a challenge for riders because new sights and sounds can make the horses skittish. But all riders kept their mounts under control and a new champion was chosen.

Have you ever wondered what it was like to be a “non-combatant” villager in the midst of battle? Children accompanied by a responsible adult joined in the villagers’ revolt. Hundreds of water balloons pelted fighters in a surprise response from villagers. The giggling was amazing!

Fire restrictions were once again in effect at this year’s Highlands. Thank you all for following Mormon Lake Lodge’s fire regulations. Camp fires using propane firepits were permitted after years of work with the Forest Service to demonstrate their safety. Mormon Lake Lodge had a strict smoking policy requiring that smoking was only allowed in vehicles. As you speak with friends from the Valley, please help them understand that although we camped on private property, fire restrictions were in effect from the Lodge.

Too Darn Hot is right around the corner. Please offer your services to our Stewards: Viscountess Diana or Lord Chavez. Remember this is Ered Sûl’s 16th birthday!

Once again, We will be traveling to Pennsic War in Pennsylvania. If you are planning to camp with Atenveldt (we don’t since we have an inter-kingdom household), PLEASE pre-register so that you get land.

Don’t forget that Ered Sûl is hosting **Fall Crown** this year. If you are an eligible fighter, please consider entering the Crown List – this is a rare opportunity for us all.

Baronial Officers – Several of the warrants for Baronial Officer Positions will be expiring in the next few months. Some officers will retire, others will stay. We are required by Kingdom Law to advertise these positions.

Thegn Gunnar, Our current A&S Champion, has graciously accepted the position of Interim A&S Officer. He has agreed to serve for a year as A&S Officer, but to make everything conform to Kingdom regulations, the position must be advertised. We have spoken with Lady Katherine the Tapester, Our current A&S Deputy, and she is content to remain as a deputy. We would like to find at least one other A&S Deputy to help lighten the load for all involved and make it easier to cover various events. Prior to stepping up as Baroness, Mistress Eirny served as an A&S Deputy.

Position: Barony of Ered Sûl A&S Officer

Requirements: The A&S Officer is a very public position. It requires a person who is outgoing, and comfortable dealing with people with all levels of A&S skill. Communication is an integral part of the A&S officer's job. Due to the extensive distances and time involved in travel within both the Barony and the Northern A&S community, internet competency is mandatory. The officer **MUST** check their SCA-specific email on a daily basis – including relevant Yahoo groups and Facebook. The Barony has an official Baronial list on Yahoo, and two unofficial lists on Facebook – one devoted specifically to A&S in Northern Atenveldt. If the officer is unable to check their email due to technological issues (email outages, etc.) they **MUST** contact the Seneschal, the Baron and Baroness and their deputies to inform them that their job needs to be “covered” until they can be back online.

In addition to the Baronial A&S presence online, the A&S officer is responsible for arranging for at least one formal A&S event a month. The Barony rents a room at the Community Center on the second Tuesday of every month. This date is intended to be used for A&S activities. It can be used for either a formal class, or a general project night. The A&S officer is responsible for making sure that either they or some other responsible individual is present for this event. In addition to the A&S night, the A&S officer should be arranging for weekend workshops at least once every other month. The A&S officer does **NOT** need to be able to teach these workshops, or the classes offered on the A&S night, but they need to recruit the teachers, or ask for help in recruiting the teachers. The officer needs to stay in contact with the Kingdom A&S officer and make use of the Kingdom resources to bring in activities such as traveling scriptoriums and visiting teachers. The workshops can be held in either a private home or in a facility that is rented by the Barony. Arranging for the location is the A&S officer's responsibility. The information on upcoming workshops and classes should be arranged several months in advance with the details being published in the monthly newsletter and broadcast on both the Yahoo and Facebook lists several times at regular intervals (a month out, two weeks out, a week out, and two days out) before each event.

The officer is required to send a formal A&S report detailing **ALL** of the A&S activities that are occurring in the Barony to the Kingdom A&S officer, their deputy(ies), the Seneschal and the Baron and Baroness every month.

The Barony holds three Baronial events a year – Highland’s War, Too Darn Hot, and Ered Sulabration. There should be appropriate A&S activities at each one of these events. Highlands War is the most complex of these events. It has an A&S area, with demos and classes, all of which must be recruited, organized, scheduled, and executed. Too Darn Hot is a much more laid back event, and A&S activities there can be much more relaxed, but should exist, if only as a “hang-out” spot for crafty people (unless there is an Investiture). The Baronial A&S Champion is chosen at Ered Sulabration. The officer must consult with the Baron and Baroness and the former champion to arrange the A&S competition and display. In addition, if the Barony continues to hold Combined practices during the year, it is the A&S officer’s job to arrange appropriate A&S activities at these events – appropriate activities include, but are not limited to European Dance, Belly Dance, scriptoriums, sewing, weaving, spinning, fiber preparation, leatherwork, embroidery, cording, and banner making.

In addition to the standard A&S activities it is the duty of the A&S officer to recruit and train deputies and their replacement.

To apply for this position, you must send a letter of intent to the Baron and Baroness. This letter must include your name, and contact information. In addition, if you are applying for the first time, We would like to hear your ideas for classes and workshops and your goals for this office. If you are currently holding this office, we would like an honest assessment of what sort of a job you feel you have been doing in this position, how you feel you can improve your performance, and your plans for future classes.

Barony of Ered Sûl Herald – Lady Lora of the Four Paws (Laura Minas) is our current baronial herald. She has expressed a desire to remain in this position, but we would like to find her a deputy. Having more than one person who understands the duties of the herald and can “cover” in the absence of the main herald is a good thing.

Requirements: The Herald Position is divided into three areas of responsibility – voice heraldry, court recording, and helping baronial members with heraldic and name submissions.

Voice Heraldry requires that the Herald is capable of starting, running and concluding a baronial court, and working with other baronial and kingdom heralds. The herald must keep track of the activities that are to occur during the court, control the distribution of scrolls and award medallions, and generally assist with the flow of court. The herald should be able to travel to distant events at least some of the time.

Court Recording means that the herald is supposed to report the awards that are given in court to kingdom so that the Kingdom OP may be kept current. The Herald needs to also keep an eye on the OP to make sure that Kingdom is entering the award information correctly.

Heraldic and Name Submissions are an important part of the Heralds duty. The populace needs assistance in negotiating the rules for name and research and submission.

To apply for this position you must send a letter of intent to the Baron and Baroness. This letter must include your name and contact information. In addition, if you are applying for the first

time, We would like to hear your ideas for classes and workshops and your goals for this office. If you are currently holding this office we would like an honest assessment of what sort of a job you feel you have been doing in this position, how you feel you can improve your performance, and your plans for the future.

Your Barony is on the move! Lots of stuff is happening and more to come. Baron Master Roger, our Baronial Historian, has been busy compiling lists of Baronial Officers since the beginning of the Barony. We will start publishing some of this historical info next month.

Don't miss our Combined Practices this summer. Once per month we'll invite everyone to come play together – Join Us this month on June 17th, 1PM at Bushmaster Park.

Site is wet. Camping allowed with PROPANE FIRE PITS ONLY. Bring your own drinking water as none is available on site. Kingdom minor curfew is in effect. Pets are welcome but they must be on leashes and you must clean up after your pet. Smoking is permitted subject to Forest Service restrictions.

Mace & Greatsword August 17-19, 2012 Barony March of Mons Tonitrus

In Anno Societatis (AS) XXIII was held the first Mace and Great Sword Tournament. Now it is time for the 25th ANNIVERSARY of that much anticipated event!

Gather at Lower Garden Canyon picnic area in the foothills of the beautiful Huachuca Mountains on Fort Huachuca. Camping under the trees with a possible cool mountain stream flowing.

Site will open Friday at 2:00 pm for setup. Site closes at 5:00 p.m. on Sunday, August 21.

The site fee to attend this event is a mere \$12 for adults with proof of membership and an additional \$2 for children ages 5 to 17. A non-member surcharge of \$5 will apply without proof of membership.

Directions: Take I-10 East to Exit 302 (Hwy 90 to Ft. Huachuca/Sierra Vista). Drive South on Highway 90 approximately 27 miles. Turn right at the intersection of the Hwy 90 and Fry Blvd to the Ft Huachuca Main gate. After entering Ft. Huachuca, follow signs to Lower Garden Canyon.

All adults will be required to show government-issued identification; those without valid DoD stickers (Fort Huachuca, Davis-Monthan, Luke, etc.) should be prepared to show registration and proof of insurance. (Currently there is no requirement to show these documents but policy tends to change without notice). Foreign nationals may need to be signed in by an ID Card holder; please inform the Site Stewards as soon as possible to ensure arrangements are made for ease in access.

All trailers are currently being visually inspected, and vehicles are also subject to random checks.

The road to site is paved, and for your safety and comfort please heed “Dips in Road” signs along with the mundane speed restrictions.

In addition to the traditional Mace and Great Sword tournament, the Baronial Champions will be determined over the course of the weekend. Bring your great swords, maces, axes and other weapons to join in the fun and test the mettle of those who wish to serve as Champions.

As always, Their Excellencies encourage heraldic display to enhance the pageantry of the tournament and add to the ambiance throughout the site.

Saturday Troll will open at 9am, with Court expected to begin at 10. There will be a brunch served following opening Court, as will the List be opened. At 1 there will be the exciting Mace and Great Sword tournament.

During the day there will be opportunities for Artisans to meet and Archers to practice. In the evening the Bardic and dance will begin. There is expected to be fierce competition, bring on your best!

On Sunday, during the Barony’s anniversary celebration, the new Baron’s Champion, Baroness’ Champion, and Baronial Archery Champions will be determined. Tournaments will be held and awards will be presented. Formats for each tournament will be determined by the current champion, in consultation with Their Excellencies. While only members of Mons Tonitrus may assume the position of champion, all good gentles are invited and encouraged to add to the competition.

Closing court shall be at the conclusion of the day’s events. Our Barony would like to invite all to share in our lovely mountain air.

The site is primitive with no running water, so please remember to bring your own drinking water. Also, remember to bring trash bags to carry yours out.

Site is wet, with modern drinking laws in force. Kingdom minor curfew will be observed. (12 & under in camp/with adult after 10 pm and 13-17 in camp/with adult after 1 am) Pets welcome and must be kept on leash.

If no fire restrictions are in place, camp fires will be allowed in above ground fire pits. This is subject to change, but no fires are allowed to be directly on the ground. Special needs attendees or those seeking hotel information or crash space should contact the autocrats.
